

# THE DIFFERENCE

Choosing a provider is important. Your child deserves professional, efficient, and comprehensive services—your child deserves the best!

**Q: Does your facility have an on-site BCBA to supervise programs?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center has both BCBA's and BCaBA's who are on site every day, allowing for consistent oversight.

**Q: Does your facility provide consistent services, with minimum breaks?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center provides consistent, year-round services with only two non-service weeks per year. Additionally, winter weather closures are rare.

**Q: Does your facility utilize an internationally accredited curriculum?**

**A:** Alpine provides a research-validated, internationally recognized curriculum developed by the Center for Autism and Related Disorders (CARD).

**Q: Does your provider document student progress in monthly reports?**

**A:** Alpine provides monthly status of skill acquisition and behavioral progress via monthly reports to keep parents apprised of all information regarding their child.

**Q: Is your provider available on a monthly basis for one-on-one meetings?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center holds monthly parent meetings to allow opportunities for parents to directly discuss their child's needs and progress with their child's team.

**Q: Does your provider offer Center-based and in-home services?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center offers both Center-based and in-home services. Your child's ABA team will come to you (even for Center-based students). This allows therapists to troubleshoot behavioral issues associated with specific timeframes (i.e., morning routine, dinner, bedtime, etc.)

**Q: Does your provider service a diverse population within the spectrum?**

**A:** Alpine services a wide range of age groups (18 months-adulthood).

**Q: Is your provider, and the facility where you receive therapy, State licensed?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center is licensed by the State of Colorado for both Day Care and Day Treatment.

**Q: Does your provider work with you to secure financing and maximize service hours?**

**A:** Alpine actively seeks to bundle funding sources to provide full day, year round programming (Tricare, public schools, private insurance, Medicaid waivers, etc.)

**Q: Is your provider a direct Medicaid provider?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center accepts Medicaid waivers (CES, CWA, and SLS) and bills Medicaid directly, saving clients up to 15% of entitlements.

**Q: Does your provider advocate for your child in the public schools?**

**A:** Alpine Autism Center's BCBA's and BCaBA's attend and actively advocate for your child at IEP meetings.
